

## Precinct Convention Results Hotline

- The TDP will be opening up a hotline the night of your Precinct Convention, March 4<sup>th</sup>, to allow the person conducting their precinct convention (i.e. whomever was elected as the Permanent Convention Chair) to report the results of that precinct convention immediately upon adjourning the convention. This hotline will open at 7:15 p.m. **Please use this service to call in your results immediately upon adjournment of your precinct convention so that we will be able to track in near real-time the precinct convention results and thus be able to offer that information more quickly to the presidential campaigns and the media.**
- When you call in to the hotline, an automated system will prompt you to provide or confirm:
  - Your Name and phone number;
  - An access code that identifies your specific precinct (see above).
  - The Number of eligible voting members on the roll: \_\_\_\_\_. This number is on your minutes form;
  - The number of Delegates your precinct is entitled to elect to County/Senatorial District Convention: \_\_\_\_\_. This number also should have been entered on your minutes form; and
  - The Number of delegates allocated to each presidential preference (or 'Uncommitted' status) as indicated on the minutes form:

- **In order to comply with state law, you will still need to mail in a copy of the precinct convention sign-in sheets and minutes to the state party and your county party within three (3) days of hosting your precinct convention.** It cannot be emphasized enough how important it is to ensure that you mail copies of the necessary precinct convention documents to your county party and to the state party. These documents will be used by the Credentials Committee of your County/Senatorial District convention to verify the delegates and alternates that were elected. These documents will also be used by the State Credentials Committee should a challenge arise.
